


COMPUTER CLEANUP

- Over time unnecessary data builds up on the computer
 - This can slow down the computer
 - Makes the hard drive work harder than necessary
 - Could possibly cause a computer malfunction
- The more you use the computer, the more frequently you need to clean it up
 - As a rule of thumb, do it once a month
 - You might consider doing it the first week of the month, before Microsoft publishes the updates for your computer
- The following procedures assume you are using Internet Explorer and Windows Mail

Computer Cleanup


- Cleaning up Internet Explorer

On the menu bar, click Tools and select Internet Options



Computer Cleanup




In the Browsing history section, click the Delete... button

In the Delete Browsing History dialog box, click the Delete all... button


Computer Cleanup



Place a check mark in the check box to delete files and settings stored by add-ons


Click the OK button

Back in the Internet Options dialog box, click the Settings button

Select Automatically


Place a number between 50 and 250 in this box

Place 7 in this box

Click the OK button

Computer Cleanup

- Open Windows Mail and delete the old e-mail messages



Delete or move unnecessary e-mail from the Inbox


The Outbox should be empty

Delete the old sent e-mail messages

Empty the Deleted Items folder

Computer Cleanup

- **Run Disk Cleanup**
 - **Click the Start button, move to All Programs, click Accessories, click System Tools, and select Disk Cleanup**




Decide what files you want to clean up



Make sure the C: drive is selected and click the OK button

Computer Cleanup




This program will not delete files or information that is essential to the operation of the computer

Place a check mark in the check box to the left of the areas you want to clean up and click the OK button

Computer Cleanup

- Here are the areas you want to clean out
 - Temporary Internet Files
 - Recycle Bin
 - Setup Log Files
 - Temporary files
 - Per user archived Windows Error Rep...
 - System archived Windows Error Repor...
 - System queued Windows Error Reporti...
 - Note: If you have Microsoft Office installed, you can remove the setup files if you have the original installation disc



After selecting the areas to clean out and clicking the OK button, click the Delete Files button in this box

Computer Cleanup

- Run Disk Defragmenter
 - Click the Start button, move to All Programs, Accessories, System Tools, and select Disk Defragmenter
 - Windows Vista defrags on a schedule that you can modify
 - You can defrag any time by clicking the Defragment now... button
- Use your antivirus program to scan the hard drive for viruses
- Update your spyware detection and removal programs and scan the hard drive for any malicious programs
